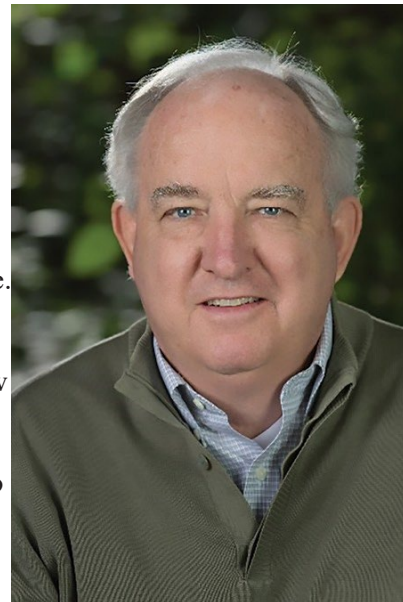

## President's perspective... "The Rangers"

I am very pleased to present the Museum's *Ranger Roll Call Interim Report & Challenge for Region 3*. A BIG THANK YOU to all the Forest Service employees and Museum volunteers who helped us create historical records for 65 national forest & grassland units throughout the nation. Each record includes the names of nearly every ranger, the dates they served, and the names and dates of prior units that may have been combined and renamed over time. The Ranger Roll Call project began in August 2019 with my letter to every district ranger in the agency asking for this information. We welcome your review of this interim report for accuracy and also challenge you to help us complete these important records for the remaining units. We have expanded the project to include forest supervisors so would appreciate your help there as well.



In the report, please note the individuals we are recognizing for their invaluable assistance. We also want to recognize Dave Stack, our Vice President and full-time volunteer Historian & Curator, who created the template and finalized the PastPerfect records that are available online here: [Advanced Search Results | National Museum of Forest Service History \(pastperfectonline.com\)](https://www.forestservicemuseum.org/pastperfectonline.com). These web pages also contain the records we have created of the station directors that served at all seven USFS research stations. The *Station Director Roll Call Interim Report & Challenge* has been completed and shared with the current station directors and the Deputy Chief for Research & Development. Many thanks also to the Museum volunteers and station employees who helped us create those records. The Museum's amazing collection of objects, photographs, documents, books, reports, and now these important records, boasts over 50,000 items, of which about 39,000 can be viewed online.

The Museum's mission – *sharing the rich history and story of America's conservation legacy* – encompasses the stories of so many people and their work, perhaps none more important than the rangers. The Museum focused on the rich history of the ranger in our summer 2020 newsletter, "The Rangers – They Broke New Ground." The Museum is moving ever closer to completing the capital campaign for the Conservation Legacy Center (CLC), the flagship building on our Missoula campus. We are well along in the architectural design and engineering of the CLC, an exhibit in itself that will feature mass timber technology and other wood elements – a tribute to the Forest Products Laboratory and its long history in wood science, engineering, and innovation. The extensive use of wood in the CLC, a renewable resource, is also a tribute to so many of us that have devoted our careers to sound forest management. Moreover, we are developing the CLC's opening exhibition, and I can assure you it will feature the rich history and contributions of the ranger and the people on the districts who were and continue to be on the frontline of conservation.

And lastly, one big thank you to Andy Mason for his diligent and passionate commitment to this project. He has been instrumental in bringing this all together across the entire outfit.

# Apache-Sitgreaves National Forest Ranger Roll Call

**History** -- The Apache National Forest is named for the Indian Nation who called east-central Arizona home. The Sitgreaves National Forest is located in east central Arizona along the southern edge of what is geologically known as the Colorado Plateau. The Forest is named for Captain Lorenzo Sitgreaves of the U.S. Army Topographical Engineers who visited the area during the years 1851 and 1852. In 1974 the Apache National Forest was administratively combined with its neighbor, the Sitgreaves National Forest.

There was a veritable tidal wave of system-wide reorganization activity by the Forest Service following the Midnight Reserves controversy beginning on March 16, 1907, until the expiration of Theodore Roosevelt's term as president in March of 1909. After the Fulton Amendment, the task of reorganizing the national forests with an eye towards effective administration began. Large forests were broken apart into several new ones, or smaller areas combined to form larger national forests. Evidence of this system-wide effort to reorganize the national forests for better administration can be found in the example provided by the breakup of the large 2.572 million acre Black Mesa National Forest in Arizona into two new national forests (Executive Order 876 of July 1, 1908) the Apache and (Executive Order 868 of July 1, 1908) the Sitgreaves, and contributing large tracts of land to the Coconino and Tonto National Forests.

# Lincoln National Forest Ranger Roll Call

**History** – Lincoln Forest Reserve is located in New Mexico and was established by presidential proclamation in July 1902. It was renamed Lincoln National Forest in 1907. Gallinas and Alamo National Forests – the latter of which was created from a merger between Guadalupe and Sacramento National Forests – combined with Lincoln National Forest in 1908 and 1917, respectively. Lincoln National Forest is credited with having the first women (Anita Pearl Kellogg) take and pass the Forest Service Ranger examination in 1921. Today, Lincoln National Forest is made up of three ranger districts: Smokey Bear, Sacramento, and Guadalupe.

# Santa Fe National Forest

History: The Forest was established on July 1, 1915 by the U.S. Forest Service with the amalgamation of Jemez National Forest to the west of Santa Fe and Pecos National Forest to the east. The former division is remembered in the ranger districts, with the Jemez Ranger District to the west and the Pecos/Las Vegas district to the east.

Pecos National Forest in New Mexico was established as the Pecos River Forest Reserve by the General Land Office on January 11, 1892 with 311,040 acres. After the transfer of federal forests to the U.S. Forest Service in 1905, it became Pecos River National Forest on March 4, 1907, and was renamed Pecos National Forest on July 1, 1908. On July 1, 1915 the entire forest was combined with Jemez National Forest to establish Santa Fe National Forest.
